

Notes From The Journey . . .



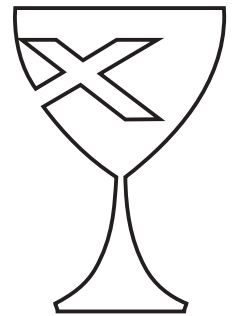

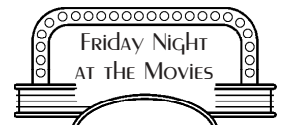
Spring Clean Up

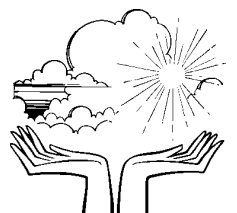
End of the Year BBQ

Bring Your Mug











