There is a stillness about this season, like waiting in the pre-dawn darkness for the wonder of the new sunrise.

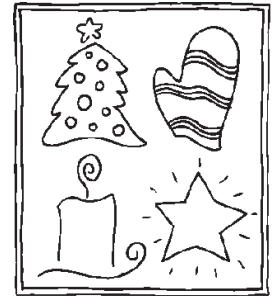

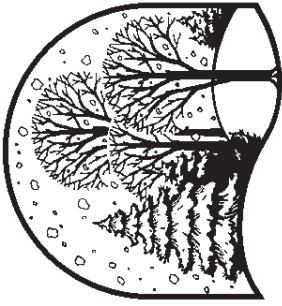
**Thanksgiving Offering**

### Tree Burning Party Sunday, Jan. 2nd — 6 p.m.

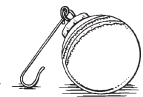
