Images and ideas about forcing faith on someone and condemning them if they don't accept it are not at all uncommon. But such images are, in fact, an aberration. Evangelism literally means to tell

the good news - to share something exciting and meaningful with someone else. It is not coercive. Indeed, it is most effective when it is freely and generously offered without coercion.

If you find meaning and support here, if you experience this congregation as a community where you feel welcomed and encouraged, if you find it to be a place where Christian faith is liberating rather than

oppressive, then I invite you to be intentional about sharing that good news with someone you know - perhaps a friend or co-worker, or maybe a member of your family, or maybe the person who cuts your hair or works on your car. It will require sincere listening on your part. It will require sensitivity to their needs. It might require a shot of courage for you to step beyond your usual comfort zone. But if you have good news to share, isn't it worth making an effort to share it? If we don't tell them, how will they know about us? Please consider making this the month you invite someone to join you in church.

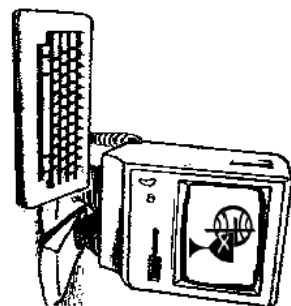
