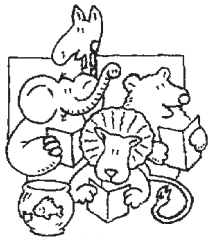
Sacred Space / Lively Space

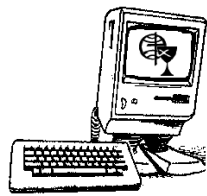


Help Wanted for Children's Program

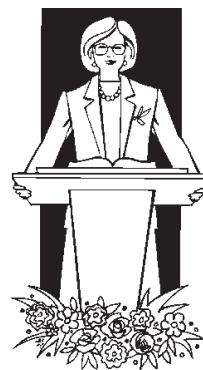
Concerns & Celebrations Within Our Community. . .

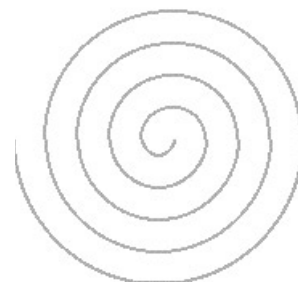
Adult Faith Exploration Class


