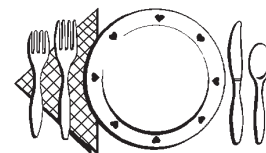
Congregational Meeting – Sunday, April 30th



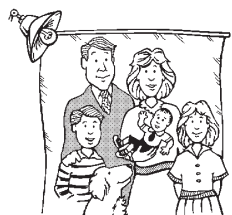

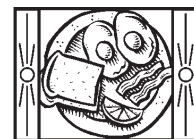
Get Your Picture Taken

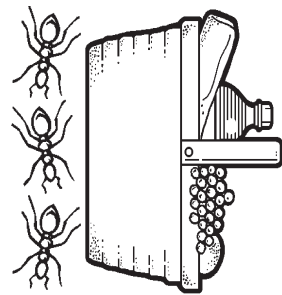
Reta Boyd is now a resident at Good Samaritan Village.

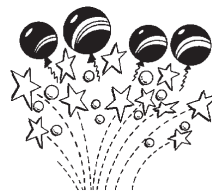

We've reserved the picnic shelter at East City Park. We'll start gathering at 11:30 a.m.

























There will be barbecues ready to receive whatever you bring to grill.
