Notes From The Journey . . .



There is a bumper sticker which reads, "If you aren't living on the edge, you are taking up too much space." I believe that our faith calls us to explore the edges - of our lives, of our world, of our faith. There is certainly a place for being comfortable, and if we spend our whole lives being comfortable we're probably missing out on a lot of life's potential.

I have recently started exploring some of my own edges in a new way - by listening for the stirrings and leadings of the Spirit through the spiritual practice of walking the labyrinth. This particular practice has been described as a walking meditation. The labyrinth is a circular path which twists and turns and eventually leads to the center. The metaphors which this practice offers for prayer and reflection are numerous - journeying, following the path, seeking the center, and on and on. I am finding my experience to be enlightening, refreshing and enlivening. In conjunction with this practice, I am also engaging in a virtual conversation (via the internet) with some colleague/friends in which we explore the themes and insights

One of the things I have become aware of through this process in recent weeks has to do with us - The United Church of Moscow. It occurs to me that it has been a while since we've been intentional about asking some of the foundational questions - who are we, who do we want to be, where do we want to go, how do we want to get there? Really grappling with questions such as

these can play an important role in helping us listen for God's leading and discover new directions for our journey together.

I am interested in gathering together a group of people who would like to engage in such an exploration. It is not yet clear to me exactly what shape such a process will take, and I am confident that together with other interested and committed individuals we can figure it out. God is present in the midst of us and life is filled with abundant possibilities. I am excited about discovering what the future holds in store - for me and for us.. - Roger

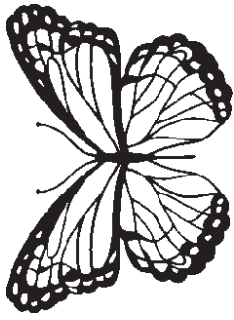
Faith Explorations Class – Begins Sunday, September 17th @ 9:30 a.m.
