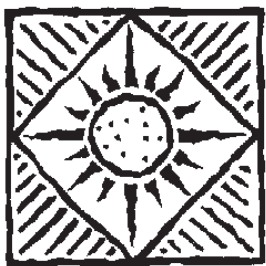
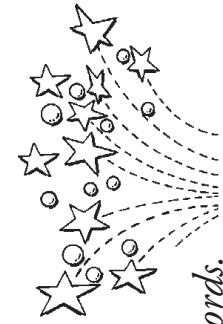


### Food For Finals – December 10th-14th

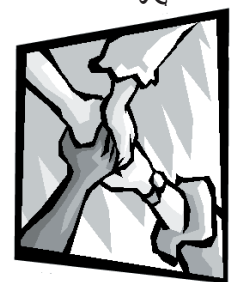
## The Board of Elders & Deacons










